Abstracts for critical papers, poetry readings/talks, roundtables, panels or paper jams are due on 1 June.

Grounded in queer, trans, antiracist, and intersectional feminist traditions, the series looks to expand familiar paradigms of academic writing, locating new methods and modes to account for a transformational feminist politics today.
