Call for papers / articles / contributions

Call for Papers: <u>Divine Disasters: Exploring Distressed Landscapes in Literature and Theology</u>, 24th February 2024, University of Warwick. This conference proposes "divine disasters" as a new lens for examining the interrelationship between theology, ecology, and literature. We invite papers that consider how ideas of faith, religion, the divine or the sacred are challenged during ecological crises. Focusing on the Spaces/Places of such disasters, we invite enquries into these distressed landscapes containing multitudinous emotions, including fear, sadness, anxiety, hope and anger, foregrounding theological queries of evil, doubt and suffering. "Divine disasters" becomes a framework to question human vulnerability and theology's big questions within narratives of distressed landscapes. This conference welcomes explorations of "divine disasters" in various forms, from imagined apocalyptic landscapes in literature to the religious implications of real-life post-disaster recovery. Abstracts of 250–300 words are due by 27th October 2023.

Call for Papers: <u>The European Society for the Study of English 2024 Conference</u>, 26–30 August 2024, Lausanne, Switzerland. As is tradition, the conference will consist of a mixture of plenary lectures, parallel lectures, roundtables, seminars, posters, and the Doctoral Symposium. Details of each format, calls for papers and how to participate can be found on the ESSE website. Individual abstracts for <u>presentations</u>, <u>posters</u> or participation in the <u>doctoral symposium</u> are due 31st January 2024.

Call for Contributions: C21 Special Issue 'Novel Media/Media Novel: Theorising Digital Media Cultures in the Contemporary Novel'. Rather than reading the contemporary novel as mimetic in nature, we invite papers which explore to what extent novels can function as a vital source of theorising the digital media cultures of our times. What are the societal contexts of staging digital media forms in literary writing in which the presence of digital media is not only the background for everyday life but plays a central role in the formal make-up of the narrative? Could we as as far as announcing that some of the contemporary novels featuring digital experience constitute the 'novel of digital ideas' as a new configuration of the 'novel of ideas' (LeMahieu 2015)? What, if any, is the symbolic function of digital media in contemporary writing? And how can interdisciplinary readings of contemporary literature contribute to innovative ways of theorising media and literature? Therefore, instead of limiting contributions to readings facilitated by current approaches within media studies, we are looking for critical contributions that develop ways to theorise digital media cultures through, with, and in contemporary fiction. Abstracts/expressions of interest are due by 1st December 2023.

Call for Contributions: <u>gender forum Early Career Researchers XI Special Issue</u>. The interdisciplinary and peer-reviewed open access journal gender forum launched its first annual Early Career Researchers Issue in October 2013 in order to encourage the next generation of scholars who work at the intersection of gender studies and literary studies, cultural studies, media studies, and/or cultural history to publish their work in a guided publication process which is specifically designed to support the first publications of emerging scholars. Ever since then, gender forum has dedicated one special issue a year to presenting the work of early career researchers (ECR). Contributions for the upcoming Early Career Researchers Issue XI (fall issue 2024) may be pieces composed specifically for the occasion or previously unpublished term papers or final theses, which have been carefully revised and adapted for the issue. Full article submissions of 3,000–5,000 words are due by 15th December 2023.

Call for Submissions: <u>Contemporary Women's Writing Essay Prize</u> aims to encourage new scholarship in the field of contemporary women's writing, recognise and reward outstanding achievement by new researchers and support the professional development of next generation scholars. *Contemporary Women's Writing* critically assesses writing by women authors who have published approximately from 1970 to the present, especially in essays that reach beyond a reading of a single text in order to challenge existing thinking or extend debates about an author, genre, topic, or theoretical perspective and relate literary analysis to wider cultural and intellectual contexts. The prize is open to anyone currently registered for PhD study or within three years of completion. Entrants may be asked to provide formal confirmation of their status. Full essays of 7,000-9,000 words are due by 1st March 2024. More details can be found on the website of the CWWA.
